# User-friendly technology smoothes the flow of perishable exports

When it comes to perishable transport, the devil is in the detail.

It's all about understanding the specialised aspects of the perishables industry, says Sydney Ramoorthy of forwarding and clearing software provider Core Freight Systems.

"An example of this is our ongoing refinement of the generation of the phytosanitary certificate, which is required to accompany the perishable goods to ensure acceptance at major delivery destinations around world," he told FTW.

"Who would have known that printing the place of origin of produce as 'South Africa' would invalidate the certificate, unless prefixed by 'Republic of'!? Similarly there is a specialised

requirement to record certain details against containers including, for example, information relating to 'vents', 'atmospheric control' and 'temperature codes'. This data is used to issue

pertinent instructions to the transporters or shipping lines direct from the CoreFreight application," he told FTW.

The perishables export business is reported to be worth in excess of R15 billion annually to South Africa – and although this amount is dwarfed by

the minerals and metals categories associated with our mining industry, it remains a significant contributor to the local economy, as both a source of foreign currency and domestic employment, said Ramoorthy.

"We have an increasing number of clients who operate in this sector," he added.
